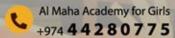

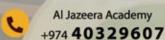

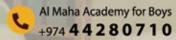

A Message from Ta'allum CEO, Mr. Ahmed Al Mannai

In the name of Allah, the Merciful - to Parents, Students, all Staff in our Academies, and wider Ta'allum Administrative teams, 'May the Peace of God, His mercy and His blessings be upon you.

At Ta'allum we are continuously readjusting and 'raising the bar' for Achievement and Quality of Teaching and all facets of our academies. There are challenges for us to meet as we seek to contribute to the success of the Oatar 2030 vision with education at its heart. The significant increase in the Thanawevah requirements for the cohort of students graduating in Summer 2024 is having a profound impact on our approaches with the very youngest boys to our young men standing on the threshold of university. These challenges, which lie ahead of us, are demanding, but I am confident that Ta'allum has the skill, experience, and drive to meet and exceed the elevated targets which we set for ourselves.

Right now, we must plan for November learning during the World Cup to avoid regression in student progress.

To meet our challenges there are some key priorities, essential in all our Academies, which I would like to reinforce. These include the following points:

• Keep Students Safe. The safety of our

students is paramount and our key priority, bar none. The much publicised and tragic death of the 4 year old child in Al Wakra drives home a salutary warning message to us all of the potential consequences if we are not careful, alert and rigorous enough with our checks and systems in all areas of school. 1st day calls in cases of student absence, mobile phone checks and strict adherence to our detailed Ta'allum policies are critical to keeping our students safe.

- Demonstrate exemplary qualities and characteristics in Leadership. Leaders at every level must accept, understand and thrive on 'accountability' carrying out their professional responsibilities with passion, dedication and commitment. The human dimensions of leadership matter. Leaders must listen well, be 'givers not takers', and they must be approachable, collaborative and visible.
- Use data to secure improvement. Ta'allum is 'data rich.' Data analysis is an essential aspect of judging how well we are meeting our targets and expectations. It is part of the distinctive Ta'allum culture and the way I expect us to work. Over time, our Ta'allum Data Analysis has become increasingly more comprehensive, reliable, and accessible to all staff. It is integral for knowing whether or not our students are doing well. The Power BI data dashboard incorporates all the important analyses. My expectation is that staff at all levels

are using Power BI as a means to secure improvement.

- GL Assessment Progress Test Data is a particularly critical aspect of Ta'allum data across Primary and Secondary, along with CEM in KG. GL is used at the start of the academic year for baselining, and at checkpoints and the end of the year to measure progress, then year-on-year. Reports are set against UK national averages and comparative data so we can reliably compare our results with those of other schools. In particular, GL data has an important role in assessing pupils' knowledge, understanding and application in the core subjects. It helps us to track progress at individual and year group level and indicates strengths and possible gaps in learning.
- High Expectation in the performance, commitment and Conduct of all staff is a 'given'.

- Meaningful teacher-student relationships are at the root of successful learning and motivating students to succeed. Students do not care how much you know until they know how much you care. The wisdom and mentorship that caring teachers provide can be life changing, especially for younger students. Strong working relationships between students and their teachers lead to student engagement and a better school. Never shout or demean students. Great teacher inspire students.
- Always Respect and Engage with Parents. This means prompt responses to enquiries, detailed and thorough information, support and building an ongoing positive dialogue at all times in a spirit of true partnership.

I thank all of you who strive to make a positive difference for the children and young people who you serve each and every day in Ta'allum. Education is not only a right, but is our duty.



A Message from Ta'allum Director of Education.

The Messenger of Allah, (Peace and Blessings be Upon Him) said:

"Verily, Allah did not send me to be harsh or obstinate; rather, He sent me to teach and to put at ease "

It is self-evident that Teaching and Learning is at the heart of Ta'allum's vision and mission our 'core business.' is why Ta'allum places such emphasis on opportunities to grow teachers' professional practice. This is why we have invested in staff through programmes ranging from the Early Career Teacher scheme right up to the National Professional Qualification for Headship. Expectations are constantly rising so we must respond actively and with determination. 'Good' (or above) is the expected lesson judgement grade for all Ta'allum teachers. Now, more than ever, our teaching must have a direct positive impact on student learning and progress.

When Ta'allum teachers work together to improve practice, students will learn more. Collaboration emphasises collective responsibility continuously improving teaching practice and thus student learning. It is critical for us all to develop a shared understanding of what excellent practice looks like. It may not be exactly the same in every classroom or phase, but there are some practices which research evidence suggests work well in most. Every teacher should seek to add to his/her repertoire of effective strategies to apply to the wide variety of learning needs that our students present with each day. Some of the key strategies which I most advocate are as follows:

The often-used maxim "tell me and I'll forget, show me and I'll remember, involve me and I'll understand" summarises why it is so important to model "what good learning looks like". Our students need to know not only what to learn and how to learn, but also what they are aiming for. It also underlines the need for experiential approaches which secure, curiosity, independence, interest, and passion in learning. These approaches extend to the level of motivation students will have to learn and progress throughout their education. Students learn best when they are thinking actively, are encouraged to think critically, and work in a variety of collaborative situations, whether individually, in pairs, small groups, or whole-class discussions.

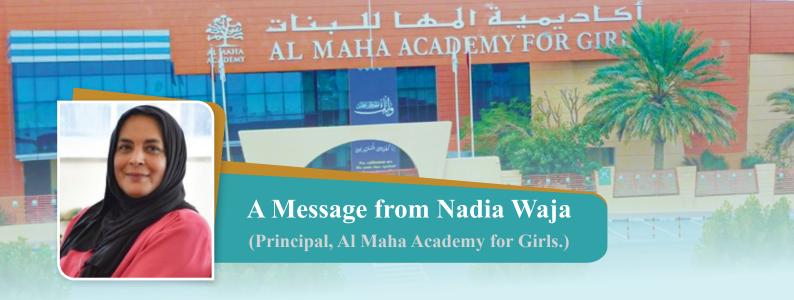
- · Good teaching and learning start with effective lesson-planning. This focuses on three issues: what we want our students to learn (the learning objectives), how they will learn (the learning activities and content) and how you will know they have learned (the learning outcomes).
- With Learning objectives, we must focus on what our students should be able to know or do at the end of the lesson that they could not do at the beginning. In order for learning objectives to be meaningful, it is important to specify the new skills that students will gain as a result of the lesson, that our focus is on student attainment and not that of the teacher. and that we are clear about what our students will learn before we clarify what we will teach
- As far as Learning Outcomes concerned, judging student learning means gathering evidence. Good teachers engage with observation, discussion, questioning and other formative strategies to gather evidence of student learning while it is going on and use this evidence to adapt teaching and planning.
- · Good teachers take time each lesson to reflect on prior learning. where students

reflect individually, in small groups or as a whole class, on what they already know, what they will find out and, later in the lesson, what they have learned.

- Teachers should present new material using small steps. "Chunking" or breaking down new learning into small bite-sized pieces helps check for understanding before moving on to the next stage, where each stage clearly builds on the foundations of the previous stage. In guiding student practice, it is also important that we gradually remove the scaffolding of support rather than suddenly taking it away.
- Good questioning is one of the most effective classroom strategies of all if you keep questions open, keep questions inclusive (i.e., you decide who answers rather than leaving it to "hands-up) and 'graduate' the questions. Checks for student understanding are vital. Effective teachers use 'hinge' questions, prepared for key points in the learning throughout the lesson.

- We must provide opportunities for students to learn at multiple levels of Bloom's taxonomy so that students can approach learning as an activity where they are required to engage with ideas, demonstrate they have understood these ideas, and can apply that learning to a variety of relevant real-life situations.
- Finally, get students thinking about their own thinking. Metacognition is about empowering our students to have control of their own thinking and how they think about learning.

I congratulate all teachers who consistently achieve 'Good' and 'Outstanding' lesson judgements, who show passion, commitment, and the capacity to inspire in all you do. Never underestimate your influence. As teachers – you change lives for the better.

In Ta'allum Early Years we continually strive to raise standards for Ta'allum's youngest learners. 2022-23 sees the introduction of a new Ta'allum Early Years Curriculum which embraces the Text Based Themes and secures progression in learning. The richness of this curriculum extends much wider than ever before, as its bespoke nature meets the progression in learning needs of Nursery (KG1) and Reception (KG2) students.

Progression within key skills, knowledge and concepts means that students experience a breadth of curriculum coverage, and engage in new and unique opportunities in each of the EYFS areas of learning. Such learning introduces students to the areas of scientific, geographic and historical elements in the Area of Understanding the World. Aspects of Physical Development involve developing and securing skills in strength, gross and fine motor skills. The key learning opportunities in Expressive Art and Design see Ta'allum students engaging in learning opportunities within aspects of visual arts, movement and the making of sounds.

The "holistic" nature of Early Years Learning embraces learning across all areas of the EYFS Curriculum, as leaders and teachers engage fully in team planning, meeting the new curriculum expectations and in securing the "what" of learning. Teachers add to the students' experiences using their professional knowledge and creativity to design the "how" of learning. At all times students remain at the centre of the curriculum, learning and the provision.

Newly created daily planning formats ensure that learning is embedded for each and every child. Lesson by lesson review of learning ensures that on-going assessment is an integral part of securing effective, creative and engaging learning for all students.

Ta'allum Early Years Classrooms are coming alive with opportunities for creative and critical thinking, exploration and investigation. Learning through play provides young learners opportunities to practise, develop and consolidate their learning.

Learning in Ta'allum Early Years Schools takes place inside and outside of the classroom. During the hot months, the communal, well-resourced indoor spaces are used to support all aspects of learning. In particular, the areas of Physical Development, Personal and Social Development and Communication and Language are a focus for learning and development. When the cooler weather arrives, all 3 EYFS schools will make good use of newly purchased outdoor learning resources which will support learners develop crucial skills and knowledge in an environment where they can be creative explorers and investigators.

Ta'allum's youngest learners also gain skills in technology and computing at the outset of their journey in education. New technology resources support learning in early programming with the use of Beebots and remote control devices. Communication and Language development is enhanced with the use of a variety of recording devices such as Talking Tins, microphones and clipboards. New tablets secure early touch screen and keyboard learning within the Reception classes – important preparation for the journey into the Primary education.

Outdoor Play



Children learn best when they are actively engaged in their environment, so it is essential that they are provided with ample opportunities to explore their environments by touching, moving, experimenting, and manipulating different objects, toys, and materials. Learning occurs best when children use their bodies to explore their surroundings and practise new skills and are actively engaged in meaningful environments. Young children are happier and healthier when they have regular opportunities to play outdoors. In AMAG we are making outdoor learning and play a regular part of our early years practice, and help ensure positive intellectual, emotional, and social development whilst building the foundations for a lifelong connection with nature and our planet.



Role Play is the most familiar experience the children can have. It relates directly to their own lives and their interests and is something that all children have in common regardless of their cultural background or previous experience. Every child can recreate experiences they have at home. Every child can recreate experiences they have at home and with careful planning and the support of skilled, attentive adults, it can provide rich learning opportunities throughout the year. It provides a context for children to explore their social and emotional lives and a familiar place for developing language and communication.

both within the setting and in their home life. We aim to provide the highest quality environment for our children to develop and reach their full potential. Collaborating with parents about their children's early experiences and development helps us at Al Maha Academy for Boys to plan for effective learning throughout their early years. It also allows us to support parents with supporting their children's education and development at home. As part of our partnership, our KG1 parents joined us for story time in class and shared part of their child's daily school routine.

Fire Safety At Al Maha Academy for Boys

Our KG Children experienced their first fire drill and exited the school safely, showing excellent leadership skills. Our children understood the importance of the training and followed their teacher's lead throughout the exercise.

The purpose of a fire drill is to familiarise and reinforce evacuation routes and practices. The goal is to train our younger ones on the proper actions to take whenever the fire alarm sounds in school so that everyone safely evacuates in an orderly manner.



Learning at Al Maha Academy for Boy KG

At Al Maha Academy for Boys, we follow the Early Years British curriculum. The EYFS Framework explains how and what each child will learn to support their healthy development. Children will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge, and demonstrating their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development. Our outstanding teachers ensure that children learn in a safe and stimulating environment, therefore always ensuring effective learning takes place. Learning must be meaningful to a child so that they are able to use what they have learned and apply it in new situations. These abilities and attitudes of strong learners will support them to learn well and make good progress in all the Areas of Learning and Development. Today's creative learners are tomorrow's future leaders.

Let's look at the three Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning.

Our Nurturing teachers help children become even more powerful learners through three Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning:

- playing and exploring I investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'.
- active learning I concentrate and keep on

trying even when I encounter difficulties. I enjoy achieving.

• creating and thinking critically – I am learning to develop my own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things.

Through playing, children can develop social and cognitive skills, mature emotionally, and gain the self-confidence required to engage in new experiences and environments.

Let's look at the some of the skills our children developed in school this term

From a small scribble to a masterpiece, drawing can enhance children motor skills from a young age. Starting them will help them improve their hand and eye coordination, while fine-tuning their finger muscles. Our boys build their confidence in their creative skills.

Early reading ignites creativity, sparks curiosity, and stimulates the imagination

of young children. Often, this leads to role-play as children grow, which helps to develop other

.In our triangle area, you can see how the environment becomes the third teacher as our children create new learning and knowledge together as they collaborate and interact in different areas. The children experiment with problem-solving and extending their thinking. They are taught by their experiences with the learning resources provided and by their interactions within the environment. This builds







skills such as empathy, problem-solving, and morality.

Our boys are using natural resources such as pinecones in class to learn all about sizes. They have learnt to use language such as "big, medium, and small. The children loved using various resources and spent a lot of time experimenting with key vocabulary learned in class

Students who have increased independence and a well-developed responsibility for their learning.

The AMAB Online World Cup kicked off at an elaborate opening ceremony attended by the coach from Al Saad FC. Each class picked an envelope to identify their chosen country.

The classes displayed great pride and enthusiasm for their chosen country and used their artistic skills and creativity to display their class doors to represent the culture of the chosen country. The Online World Cup tracked and monitored the usage of Numbots and RWI E- library for Year 1 and 2 and Century Tech and Accelerated Reader for Year 3 -6 and it included both English and Arabic subjects. Last academic year, AMAB read approximately 1.8 million words, already in 3 months the boys have read 3.6 million words.

Classes competed against each other on a weekly basis, thus students encouraged and supported their classmates to be consistent and complete more than just the required tasks.

The camaraderie and sense of belonging has helped boys with lower self-esteem gain a sense of belonging and community.

After what seemed like forever, children have the opportunity to get a breath of fresh air and play outdoors during their breaks. Outdoor settings provide opportunities for adventurous and challenging play.

Our health and wellbeing have fast become top priorities as we emerged from the pandemic, and we do everything we can to stay safe and healthy. Research shows that outdoor play experiences provide multiple physical and mental benefits for children. These include reduced obesity levels, increased physical activity, improved concentration, and enhanced social skills. Children are intrinsically motivated to move when given multiple opportunities for play outdoors.

It's no secret that children love heading for the playground as soon as they're released for break. It's one part of their school day that's within their control — they can play with their friends, be creative, and take a break from studying. However, breaktime is more than just a fun break. Regular outdoor play is integral in a child's development and often leads to improved academic performance inside the classroom. Time in the playground encourages children to be active while engaging

in helpful socialization with one another. Playgrounds and breaktimes are also where many students begin to form their identity and develop essential life skills. The ability to navigate group settings is crucial for the social development of a child. Playgrounds offer an equal meeting place for children of different backgrounds and experiences to come together. In one survey, 95% of teachers agreed that breaktime improves their students' social interactions. Through play, children learn how to communicate with their peers and learn valuable skills, such as compromise, understanding, compassion and conflict resolution.

Opportunities for outdoor play haves many benefits for learning, including an increased ability to focus and concentrate when children return to the formal classroom.

Safety and well being remain the number one priority at AMAB, thus playtime is more than just free play. Year 1- 3 children have the choice to play with multiple different sensory objects on the playground. They can choose to play by themselves, in pairs or smaller groups. Year 4-6 children have daily football matches organised and supervised by the PE department.

LEARNING SUPPORT DEPARTMENT



Al Maha Academy Learning Support Department was established in September 2010 to provide extra help and support for students who are struggling with the curriculum. We are a team of well- experienced and

qualified teachers in Special Education. Math, Arabic and English as a Second Language.

A learning difficulty can affect anyone and does not mean that a child is 'not normal'. It is estimated that between 15-20% of students suffer from a learning difficulty. With the correct support and help, students with learning

difficulties can reach their potential nd progress steadily.

In Learning Support, we provide two different ways of assisting students depending on their individual needs:

In-class intervention: LD teacher will stay in class with the student to facilitate learning.

-Withdrawal: The student will work in one of the Learning Support classrooms, twice or thrice weekly, where she/he will be taught according to their educational needs.

THE LEARNING SUPPORT CLASSROOMS

The Learning Support Classrooms are designed and

equipped with multisensory teaching and learning aids, which include pleasing and colourful visuals, prompts and educational games which, while promoting knowledge, help the students to feel confident, comfortable and protected.











LEARNING SUPPORT ACTIVITIES

SPELLING AND PHONICS

Development of phonological skills to aid in spelling and reading are supported through provision of engaging tools and activities during withdrawal classes.

IT'S MATH TIME!

Math Weeks, filled with lots of exciting activities that develop computational skills and mathematical applications, are carried out several times in a semester.

E-LEARNING

A host of applications such as Clicker 7, Accelerated Reader, Kahoot!, Immersive Reader and CenturyTech are used in the classes to promote learning and understanding of key concepts.

TO SPACE AND BEYOND - DIARY ENTRY ACTIVITY

We explored space and the different planets to support our diary entry activity about a trip to space.

EDUCATIONAL GAMES

Educational games are used to enhance understanding of punctuation, pronouns, nouns, verbs, adjectives, conjunctions as well as to improve memory, often used in unison with planned lesson objectives.

PERSUASIVE SPEAKING AND WRITING

Students used persuasive words and sentence starters to debate why their choice of animal would make the best class pet. They then wrote their argument on small white boards.





DESCRIPTIVE WRITING

Picture and word prompts are used to help in descriptive writing. Alternative adjective, character, setting and feeling descriptions words mats are regularly provided to improve vocabulary and writing.

HIGH FREQUENCY WORDS

Weekly spelling lists composed of high frequency words are taught through phoneme blocks or cards and regularly tested as a key IEP objective.

SEQUENTIAL STORY TELLING

Students are helped to understand model texts through sequential story telling and story maps.

MULTIPLICATION AND ADDITION

Specially designed math teaching aids are used to turn our students into addition and times-tables rockstars.

NEWSPAPER REPORTS!

Templates, essential vocabulary through Talk4Writing and flashcards, in addition to small teacher-student ratios, allow the students to enhance their proficiency over English language.

SHARING AND CARING

Students are encouraged to work in groups to complete tasks, to promote the culture of sharing and caring for others.

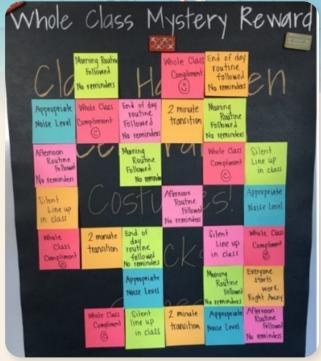

Al Jazeera created another successful partnership with Qatar University this semester. Two secondary students were enrolled in the "I am a Researcher Competition." Abdulla Ali Al-Khanji and Abdulrahman Ali Al-Khanji have been selected to design an electronic car with University professors' cooperation and use professional equipment under the supervision of the QUYSC team. The two secondary students will attend the workshops at Qatar University every Sunday and Monday.



- This track gives the chance to Qatari high school students to work as Research Assistants within Qatar University Laboratories.
- Students will have the chance to work with University professors and professional equipment under the supervision of the QUYSC team enrich students' knowledge of materials science and engineering, history, and more.
- This track enhances the student's research skills and soft skills required for university entrance
- Students are familiarized with the steps of research i.e. generating a hypothesis, gathering



data, experimenting, constructing evidence based on data, and consequently drawing conclusions either propagating forward to advanced research or solving a scientific problem.

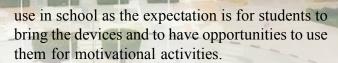

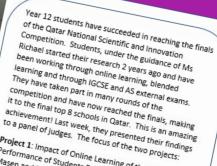

Student Leadership at AMAB

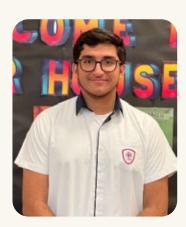
